

ASHISH BOSE

Dr. Ashish Bose is Honorary (Emeritus) Professor, Institute of Economic Growth (IEG). He was head of the Population Research Centre of IEG. After retirement, he was Jawaharlal Nehru Fellow and a Visiting Professor at JNU. He was a member of the National Commission on Urbanisation appointed by Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi. He was a member of the Advisory Committee to Monitor the Twenty Point Programme. Later, he was Chairman of the Expert Committee set up by the National Commission for Minorities to examine Census data on religion. **Currently, he is a member of the reconstituted National Commission on Population headed by Prime Minister Manmohan Singh.**

He has written and edited over 25 books on population and development. His latest books are : *Growing Old in India: Voices Reveal, Statistics Speak* (with Mala Kapur Shankardass, New Delhi (2004); *Women's Empowerment Through Capacity Building: Enduring Efforts in Bangladesh* (Delhi edition : 2004, Dhaka edition : 2005); *Darkness at Noon : Female Foeticide in India* (with Mira Shiva), VHAI, New Delhi 2003; *India's Billion Plus People: 2001 Census Highlights* (New Delhi, 2001).

His forthcoming books are *India's Quest for Population Stabilisation* (National Book Trust) and *Head Count: Memoirs of a Demographer* (Penguin Books).

He was **President** of the Indian Association for the **Study of Population** (IASP) for three terms. He was Chairman of the New Delhi Conference (1989) of the **International Union for the Scientific Study of Population** (IUSSP, Paris), attended by over 1100 delegates from all over the world. Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi inaugurated this Conference.

He was United Nations Resource Person (expert) at the Second, Third and Fourth Asian and Pacific Population Conferences held at Tokyo (1972), Colombo (1982) and Bali (1992).

He has lectured on Population and Development issues all over the world. In 2005 he participated at the China-India Roundtable at Hong Kong. He used to lecture regularly at the Foundation Course of the National Academy of Administration, Mussoorie and also at the prestigious National Defence College, New Delhi.

He is Chairman of the Society for Applied Research in Humanities (SARH), an NGO recognised by Government of India and the United Nations. He is also the Vice-President of the National Institute for Urban Affairs (NIUA), New Delhi.

He writes regularly for *Economic and Political Weekly*, Mumbai; *Health for the Millions*, (journal of the Voluntary Health Association of India), New Delhi and *Power Politics*, New Delhi.
